# **Descriptions**

An impressive document, written on a single large sheet of parchment, 83cm x 65cm, indented at the top edge and with four seals through a fold at the foot which is also stitched at the left and right edges with strips of parchment. A very ornate 'This Indenture' appears to have been printed, perhaps woodblocked, and is embellished with a portrait of George III and the royal coat of arms of the time showing the fleur de lys for France and the arms of Hanover:

**This Indenture** made the First Day of August in the Seventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third by the Grace of God of Great Britain

France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and so Forth and in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty Seven

of Great Britain to them some or one of them in hand paid by the said Mary Colebatch Before the Execution hereof (To Witt) the Sum of Fifty three Pounds

thirteen Shillings and four pence to the said Elizabeth Foxall Mary Collier and Samuel Williams and the Sum of four Pounds Six Shillings and Eight Pence to the said Ann Cownley

the severall receipts the receipt whereof they do hereby severally and respectively Acknowledge they the said Elizabeth

Foxall Mary Collier Samuel Williams and Ann Counley **Have** and each of them **Hath** Granted Bargained and Sold and by these Presents **Do** and each of them **Doth** Grant Bargain and Sell unto the said Mary Colebatch her Executors Adm[inistrat]ors<sup>i</sup> and Assigns """

## **To have and to hold** All and Singular

the said Messuage or Tenement Garden Piece and Parcell of Land and Premisses above mentioned and every Part and Parcell thereof with the Appurtenances unto the said Mary Colebatch her Executors adm[inistrat]ors and Assigns from the day next before the date of these Presents for and during and until the full end and term of one whole year thence next and Immediately ensuing and fully to be compleat and ended **Yielding and paying** Therefore one Pepper Corn in and upon the Feast of the Nativity of our Blessed Lord next coming if Demanded **To the Intent** That By virtue of these Presents and by force of the Statute made for Transferring of uses into Possession She the said Mary Colebatch may be in the Actual Possession of All and Singular the said Premisses above mentioned with the Appurtenances and thereby be Enabled to Accept and take a Grant and Release of the Revertion and Inheritance thereof to [her] heirs To the only proper use and behooft of the said Mary Colebatch her heirs and assigns forever
