the said John Fox and George Colebatch Have and each of them **Hath** bargained and Sold and by these presents **Do** and each of them **Doth** Bargain and Sell unto the said William Cock his Executors Administrators and Assigns

the Date of these presents for and during and unto the full End and Term of one whole Year from thence next ensuing and

fully to be compleat and ended Yielding and paying unto the said George Colebatch his Heirs and Assigns the Rent of one pepper Corn only on the last Day of the said term if the same be then lawfully demanded **To the intent** and purpose that by virtue of these presents and by Force of the Statute made for transferring of Uses into Possession he the said William Cock may be in the actual possession of all and singular the same Hereditaments and may thereby

enabled to accept and take a Grant and Release of the Reversion Remainder and Inheritance thereof to him and his heirs **To and for** the only proper Use and Behoof of the said William Cock his Heirs and Assigns forever and to and for no other use Intent or purpose whatsoever
