Know all Men by these presents That We George
 Colebatch of Cleobury Mortimer in the County of Salop
 Miller also Cousin and Heir at Law of Timothy Ball late
 of Prior's Dilton in the said County of Salop since of Saint
 Thomas's Street in the Borough of Southwark and County
 of Surrey Surgeon and afterwards a Surgeon in the
 Army but now deceased) and Thomas Fox of the
 Watchhouse in the parish of Keen Savage in the said
 County of Salop Yeoman are jointly and severally
 held and firmly bound unto William Cock of Cardall
 in the parish of Cleobury Mortimer in the County of
 Salop aforesaid Yeoman in the sum of Two Hundred
 Pounds of lawful Money of Great Britain to be paid
 to the said William Cock or his certain Attorney
 Factors Administrators and Assigns for the true
 payment value of the bond ourselves jointly and
 each of us severally by himself our several and
 respective Factors Administrators and Administrators and
 every of them in the whole jointly by these presents
 Sealed with our seals dated this Thirtieth — Day
 of September in the forty fifth Year of the Reign of
 our Sovereign Lord George the Third by the Grace of
 God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain & Ireland and
 King Defender of the Faith and in the Year of our
 Lord One thousand eight hundred and Six —

Whereas by certain Indentures of Leas and Release the
 Leas bearing Date the Day next before the Date of the Release
 and the Release bearing even Date herewith and made
 between John Fox of Cleobury Mortimer aforesaid Gentleman
 only Son and Heir at Law and also sole Factor named in
 the last Will and Testament of John Fox late also of the same
 place Gentleman deceased of the first part the said George
 Colebatch of the second part and the said William Cock of
 the third Part In Consideration of the sum of One hundred
 Pounds Purchase Money paid as therein mentioned the
 said George Colebatch did Grant and Assign unto the said
 William Cock his Heirs and assigns forever a certain
 Messuage or Premise called or known by the Name of
 the New House with the Garden and piece of Land thereto
 unto belonging called and known by the Name of the
 Ring containing by Estimation about half an acre which
 Premises are situate in the parish and near to the Town



of Clebury Mortmire aforesaid and now in the Occupation
of the said William Cocke or his Heir or Heirs as by the
same Indenture of Release may more fully appear Now
the Condition of this Obligation is such that if the said
William Cocke his Heirs and assigns do and shall from
Time to Time and at all Times forever here after peaceably
and quietly enter into and upon have hold and occupy
possess and enjoy the said Possession given Land and
Hereditaments with the appurtenances and receive and
take the rents issues and profits thereof and of every
Part thereof to and for his and their own the Benefit
and Disposal without any Let Suit Trouble Denial
Writition Molestation Interruption or disturbance
whatsoever of from or by the said George Colebatch his
Heirs or assigns or any person or persons lawfully
claiming or to claim from by this under or In Trust
for them any or either of them or from by them or under
the said Timothy Hall deceased or any of his ancestors
And that free and clear and absolutely acquitted and
discharged of and from all former and other Gifts
Grants Bargains Sales Mortgages Jointures Dowries Merges
Trusts Wills Legacies Testaments Statutes Judgments Recou-
rages Grants, Headlands, Foundations and all other Estates Titles
Troubles Charges and Incumbrances whatsoever at
any Time heretofore had made committed executed
or suffered or at any Time hereafter to be had made
done committed executed or suffered by the said George
Colebatch or his Heirs or by the said Timothy Hall
deceased or his Heirs or any of his ancestors Till
this Obligation to be void and of no Effect or else to
remain in full force and Virtue.
