This Indenture made the thirteenth

day of May One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine between Thomas ^{Hammoud} Rain the Younger of the New House Farm, Blebury Mortimer in the County of Salop Farmer of the one part and William Rose of Blebury Mortimer aforesaid Clerk to the guardians of the other part **Whereas** by an Indenture of Conveyance dated the twenty-fourth day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three and made between John Holdes Edwards of the one part and Caroline Hammonds of the other part for the consideration therein mentioned the hereditaments hereinafter described and intended to be hereby assured were granted and sold unto and to the use of the said Caroline Hammonds her heirs and assigns for ever **And Whereas** the said Caroline Hammonds on the sixth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four borrowed from the said William Rose the sum of One hundred and fifty pounds and as security therefor gave him a promissory note for that amount and at the same time charged the repayment thereof on the hereditaments comprised in the hereinbefore recited Indenture of the twenty-fourth day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three **And Whereas** the said Caroline Hammonds died a Spinster and Intestate on the sixteenth day of November One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six leaving the said Thomas Rain party hereto his heir-at-law. — **And Whereas** the said Thomas Rain has been in receipt of the rents of the aforesaid hereditaments since the death of the said Caroline Hammonds **And Whereas**

there is now due and owing to the said William Rose
upon the security of the hereinbefore recited promissory note
and equitable charge the before mentioned sum of
one hundred and fifty pounds and a considerable arrear
of interest. **2nd Whereas** for the purpose of more
effectually securing the same the said Thomas ^{Haymond} Rain
has at the request of the said William Rose agreed to
execute these presents in manner hereinafter appearing.

3rd Whereas that in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and twenty-three
pounds ten shillings now due and owing to the said
William Rose as aforesaid the correctness whereof the
said Thomas ^{Haymond} Rain hereby acknowledges the said
Thomas ^{Haymond} Rain hereby covenants with the said W. Rose
to pay to him on the thirteenth day of November next
the sum of Two hundred and twenty-three pounds
ten shillings with interest thereon in the meantime
after the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum
computed from the date of these presents and also
so long after that day as any principal money
remains due under these presents to pay to him interest
thereon by equal half-yearly payments on the thirteenth
day of May and the thirteenth day of November

Provided always that if and whenever the half
years interest for the said sum of Two hundred twenty
three pounds ten shillings after the rate of four
pounds per centum per annum shall be paid upon
the half-yearly days hereinbefore appointed for
payment of interest or within one calendar month
thereafter the same shall be accepted in lieu

of and in satisfaction for the interest after the rate
of five pounds per centum per annum payable for
that half year under the foregoing covenant in
that behalf but no claim for reduction should be
made under this clause in respect of any half
yearly payment of interest not made within the
time aforesaid.
